



Ovarian cancer

is when abnormal cells in the ovaries or in the related areas of the fallopian tubes grow out of control.

Risk factors

- Inherited gene changes
- Obesity
- Trouble getting pregnant
- Abnormal menstrual history
- Family history



Symptoms

- Pain in the abdomen or pelvis
- Bloating, change in bowel habits
- Indigestion or nausea
- Vaginal bleeding or discharge
- Feeling full too quickly or difficulty eating



Diagnosis

- Regular cancer screening tests may find cancers early, when treatments work best
- Diagnostic tests are used when a person has symptoms



Treatment

- Surgery for removal of cancers
- Chemotherapy to shrink or kill the cells
- Targeted therapies to stop cancers from spreading



Ovarian Cancer often goes undetected and has no symptoms in the early stages. Consult doctors and book screening tests on WoW to identify and treat it before it's too late.



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
